## THE CLOCK IS TICKING ON RECORDKEEPING

FDA has finalized its recordkeeping rule regarding the Bioterrorism Act and it will be implemented in stages starting in less than a year. As with the registration and prior notice of importation rules, there could be serious penalties for you and your food business if you aren't complying with the regulations.

That's why The Food Institute, Ohio State University and Olsson, Frank & Weeda P.C. are presenting a one-day seminar entitled **COMPLYING WITH FDA'S FINAL RECORDKEEPING & OTHER BIOTERRORISM RULES** on Wednesday, February 16, 2005. Four rules are being utilized to implement the Bioterrorism Act, including: registration of food facilities, prior notice of imported food shipments, recordkeeping and administrative detention. All are of critical importance to the food processing, storage and manufacturing industries.

- The records you have to keep about the foods you buy and sell
- What you have to tell FDA about each food you import, every time you import
- How to register your facility with FDA
- What will happen if you don't follow these new requirements

## WHO SHOULD ATTEND?

Food manufacturers, brokers, plant managers, quality assurance personnel, production supervisors, regulatory directors, traffic managers, importers, and industry executives will all benefit from learning about FDA's new requirements and will need practical guidance on how to comply with them.
